GREENS CHALLENGE IN KINGHAM, ENSTONE & ROLLRIGHT

Green vote triples in District Council election

Residents have shown their support for Barry Wheatley and the Green Party in recent local elections.

Green vote tripled since the previous election to come second in the ward with 30% of the votes cast.

This mirrors a wider trend across the country as people recognise the dedicated and hard work shown by Green councillors making a change on real local issues.

Elsewhere in West Oxfordshire, Sandra Simpson was elected in Witney North to become the third Green on the District Council, while nationally Green councillors increased from 537 to 738.

AIR QUALITY: HEALTH HAZARD TACKLED AFTER 18 YEARS

Action finally being planned in Chipping Norton



Arron welcomes plans to finally tackle harmful pollution in Horsefair/High St

Chipping Norton town centre was identified as a pollution hotspot in 2005. An Air Quality Action Plan was agreed in 2008 but little or no action has been taken and levels of nitrogen dioxide continue above national health limits, harmful to hearts, lungs and development.

With the new Council administration came new commitment to tackle pollution. Consultation on a new draft Action Plan is open at https://tinyurl.com/chippy-aq. Green campaigner Arron Baker said, "It is great to see progress finally being made on this vital health issue – I encourage everyone to review the plan and contribute their ideas."

NATURE RECOVERY: WHAT CAN I DO?

Easy steps for a nature-friendly garden

- Create wildlife highways by making 13cm holes in fences
- Log piles make the perfect bug hotel
- Avoid pesticides and let some weeds grow- wildlife loves them!
- Don't cut your lawn May-July or leave some areas long
- Sow a wildflower seed mix to create a mini meadow
- Support micro-organisms by mulching instead of digging
- Leave a few undisturbed corners
- Rocks and large stones are also a great option

Rewilded gardens will keep themselves in check giving you more time to appreciate and enjoy them.

LAST BANK CLOSES IN CHIPPING NORTON: Barclays is due to close on 6 July. Some banking services are available at the Post Office in the Co-op. For businesses or those who find it harder to get online, TSB are providing a pop-up service on a Tuesday in the Town Hall with Barclays expected to do something similar.
